MEASURE P TO REPAIR 2 MILLION SQ. FT. OF STREETS MAJOR STREETS TO BE IMPACTED

Monterey, CA. – Street maintenance and repairs, funded by the Measure P sales tax, are underway in the City of Monterey. Between March 21 and April 1, crews will be working on road sections in many neighborhoods. This work will impact some major roads and thoroughfares, including Garden Road, Pacific Street, Pearl Street and Lower Ragsdale. In the next two weeks, badly damaged pavement will be removed and replaced.

This work will prepare the streets for the final surface treatment.

In mid-April, slurry seal will be applied to streets in several neighborhoods and business districts. A slurry seal is a thin maintenance treatment consisting of a mixture of asphalt emulsions, graded aggregates, mineral fillers, water and other additives.

Anyone living, working or commuting in an area scheduled for street repairs may be affected in the following ways:

- On-street parking may be restricted
- Streets may be closed and detours may be in place
- Sidewalks at intersections may be closed



Construction will take place in phases, with a gap in between spot repairs to distressed streets and slurry seal work. All street work is dependent on weather conditions and temperatures, and schedules may shift as a result.

Measure P is a sales tax measure that funds street, sidewalk and storm drain repairs in Monterey. Last year, 1.28 million square feet of streets were improved. The next phase will repair over 2 million square feet.
